




The tree on the campus of Coleman College

#### Introduction:




Oliver Lewis Coleman, born free to slave parents, obtained his rudimentary schooling on the "master's" plantation. After the Emancipation Proclamation, Reconstruction provided a means to continue his pursuit of education and he later attended and graduated from Alcorn A&M College in Lorman, Mississippi. This led to his vision and ultimate goal, the establishment of Coleman Male and Female Academy, the predecessor to Coleman College. This Historically Black College (HBCU) in Gibsland, Louisiana was the first school for freed slaves located in Northern Louisiana... an area rife with racism, intolerance and bigotry.

After interviewing various relatives, including his grandfather, mother and others, John Marks began his search for answers. How, with little funding and meager resources, was O.L. Coleman able to launch and sustain an effort to build a college? How did he find the support, the teachers and the students? How did he evade and cope with the racist atmosphere and attitude of the post civil war South?

And perhaps the most intriguing and elusive question

- why did Oliver Lewis Coleman set out to do this?

#### The Descendent:

John R. Marks, III. was among the first African-Americans to attend Florida State University (FSU) and the FSU College of Law. He is a successful and accomplished attorney, public servant, mentor and the great-grandson of Oliver Lewis Coleman. Marks is the longest-serving mayor in the history of Tallahassee, FL. As the youngest—and the first African-American—appointed to the Florida Public Service (utilities) Commission in 1979, he also served as chairman. He has been an adjunct professor at Florida State and Florida A&M universities.

Marks 'affiliations include the American, National, Florida, and Tallahassee Bar and Barristers Associations. Recognized as a Distinguished FSU Grad, he has also been inducted into the Florida A&M Education Gallery of Distinction.

As a captain in the United States Air Force (USAF), assigned to the JAG Corp, Marks served his country during the Vietnam War.

Marks has served as president of both the Florida League of Mayors and the Florida League of Cities and appointed to the US Conference of Mayors Board of Trustees. As Mayor, Marks 'agenda focused on economic development and social equality, targeting veterans, the elderly, and the homeless and his tenure included a yearly Summit on Race, Culture, and Human Relations. He valued and prioritized relationships with sister cities and international partners. On Marks 'watch, Tallahassee became the first city in the US to develop a smart-grid utility system, leading to its designation as the top Public Utility in the nation and the title, "America's Most Livable City."

Like his great-grandfather, Marks is driven by a deep sense of purpose. But there is an accomplishment that eludes Marks: uncovering and revealing the "complete story" of Oliver Lewis Coleman and Coleman College so that this period in history can be honored, recognized and preserved for generations to come... a fascinating, untold story of a truly great American.


# Why this Documentary?





As an adolescent I remember family gatherings and discussions surrounding life in Northern Louisiana. There were summer visits and extended conversations about both of my mother's grandfathers, one an educator, the other a successful land owner and farmer. The portrayals of family life were expressed with pride and reverence. My mother, Mildred Coleman Marks, talked about both grandfathers in such glowing terms it was clear that Oliver Lewis Coleman and Robert Lewis were quite unique and accomplished.

Unfortunately, their accomplishments and legacies had not been chronicled. They each had such distinct and rich histories that writing about both in one book would be daunting. So, in the summer of 1977 after interviewing my grandfather, M.M. Coleman, Sr., I made a commitment to ensure that the history of Coleman College and its founder Oliver Lewis Coleman would be properly honored, preserved and shared.



# Serendipity:



Call it fate or serendipity, during his early efforts to write a book about Coleman College, Marks was contacted by Patrick Anderson, a grad student at the University of Central Florida. Anderson's father graduated from Coleman and in his search to find out more about his father, he decided to dedicate his masters thesis to the story behind the creation of the school. Astounded that they both shared this common goal of uncovering the rich history of Coleman College, Marks and Anderson teamed up and set out to discover the truth about O.L. Coleman, Coleman College and its legacy of distinguished alumni.

The documentary "Coleman College: the Forgotten HBCU" shares the journey of John Marks as he travels the country and talks to family, friends, and historians to uncover the facts and truth about his family's amazing legacy.

# Pre-production for the Coleman College documentary began in February of 2022. Filming for the project began in May of 2022.
